



The Charles Redd Graduate Fellowship

The Religious Studies Program and the History Department at Utah State University announce a new graduate research fellowship in religious history, with a focus on South Asia.

What: The fellowship offers in-state tuition and \$10,000 stipend for one year of graduate study, renewable for a second year depending on the availability of funding and the student's performance. (Waivers are often available to cover the difference between in-state and out-of-state tuition.) The successful candidate will work as a research assistant for Prof. Ravi M. Gupta, Charles Redd Chair of Religious Studies, while pursuing a Master's degree in History at USU.

Who: Applicants should have a bachelor's degree in Religious Studies, History, or a related discipline, with an interest in Hinduism or South Asia. Students who have some ability in Sanskrit or another Indian language are particularly encouraged to apply.

In their personal statements, applicants should mention that they are interested in the Charles Redd Graduate Fellowship. No other formal application is necessary. The final deadline for admission applications is February 1st.
